Director's Report

Employee Service Recognition. On June 20th we held a long overdue staff event to recognize the service of ODL employees. The state provides certificates and pins to agencies in five year increments for presentation to employees for service to the State. We presented certificates and pins to forty-four ODL staff members who have provided five hundred sixty-five combined years of employment at the Oklahoma Department of Libraries. Begun under Governor Keating the event is designed for families to explore Oklahoma's rich heritage and diversity, its worlds of agriculture and farming, an array of entertainment and arts and crafts. Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation. There have been two recent opportunities for grant applications to the Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation. The first is for a Rural Library Sustainability grant which will provide training to public librarians throughout the state. Linda Gens of the Office of Library Development is the coordinator for this grant. The bulk of the funding will pay for training. ODL staff will be trained on the curriculum developed for the Foundation and then will offer training across the state for public librarians. The public librarians will receive mileage reimbursement, overnight lodging if necessary, and compensation for a substitute to cover their library if it's a one person operation. The grant will also fund sending three public librarians to a national library conference.

The other grant is to replace the public access computers provided to the public libraries in 1999 by the Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation. Every library will have the opportunity to receive as many computers as they originally received. We are still in the preliminary stages of learning about this grant and how it will work but we are so appreciative of the continuing commitment of the Foundation for their generosity. If all eligible libraries are funded, the gift will be \$642,000 to the public libraries in the state. This will be a tremendous help for the public libraries in the state who all struggle to meet the demand for technology by their customers.
