Contests of Candidacy and Election

Any candidate may contest the candidacy of any other candidate for the same office by filing a written petition with the Election Board where the Declaration of Candidacy was filed before 5:00 p.m. on the Friday following the close of the filing period.

A candidate for president or a candidate for a state or county office may contest an election in which he or she was a candidate by filing a written petition with the secretary of the Election Board where the Declaration of Candidacy was filed, before 5:00 p.m. on the Friday following the election.

Changes in political affiliation may not be made during the period beginning at 5:00 p.m. on July 1 and ending at 5:00 p.m. on September 30 in any even-numbered year.

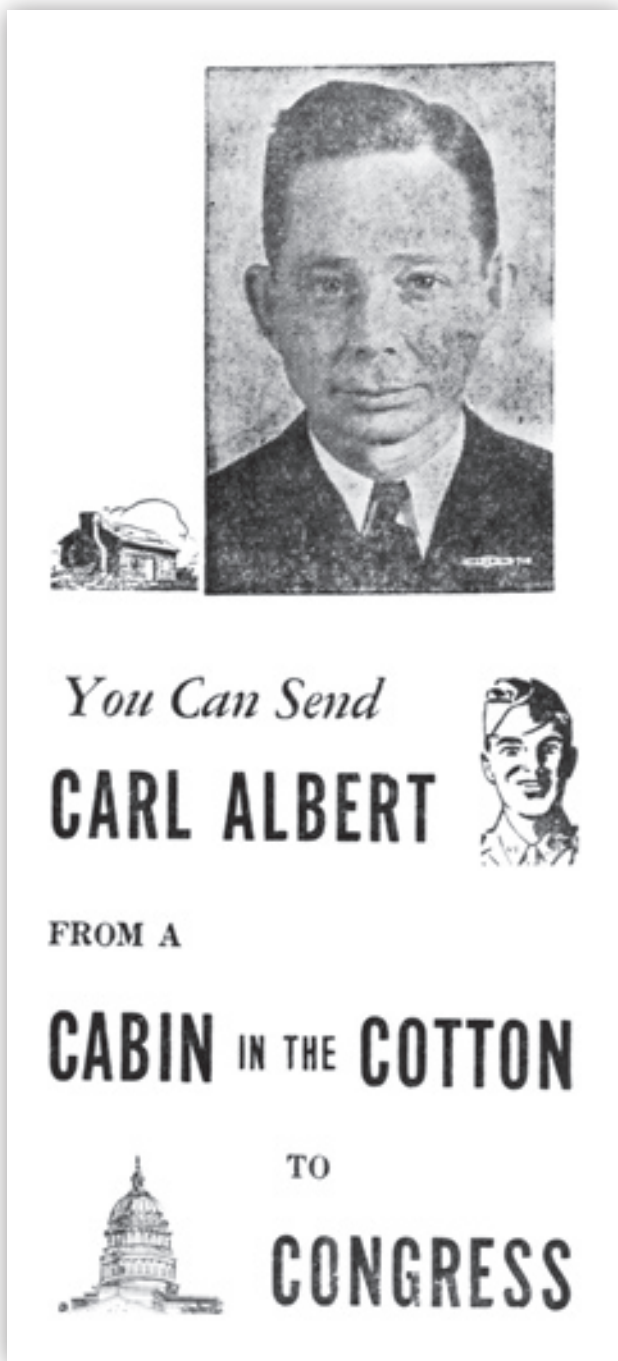
